

Lyme disease, also known as Lyme borreliosis, is an infectious disease caused by bacteria of the Borrelia type which is spread by ticks. The most common sign of infection is an expanding area of redness on the skin, known as erythema migrans, that begins at the site of a tick bite about a week after it has occurred.

Common

More than 200,000 US cases per year

Treatable by a medical professional

Spreads by animals or insects

Requires a medical diagnosis

Lab tests or imaging often required

Deer ticks can carry the bacteria that causes Lyme disease.

Lyme disease causes a rash, often in a bull's-eye pattern, and flu-like symptoms. Joint pain and weakness in the limbs also can occur.




